

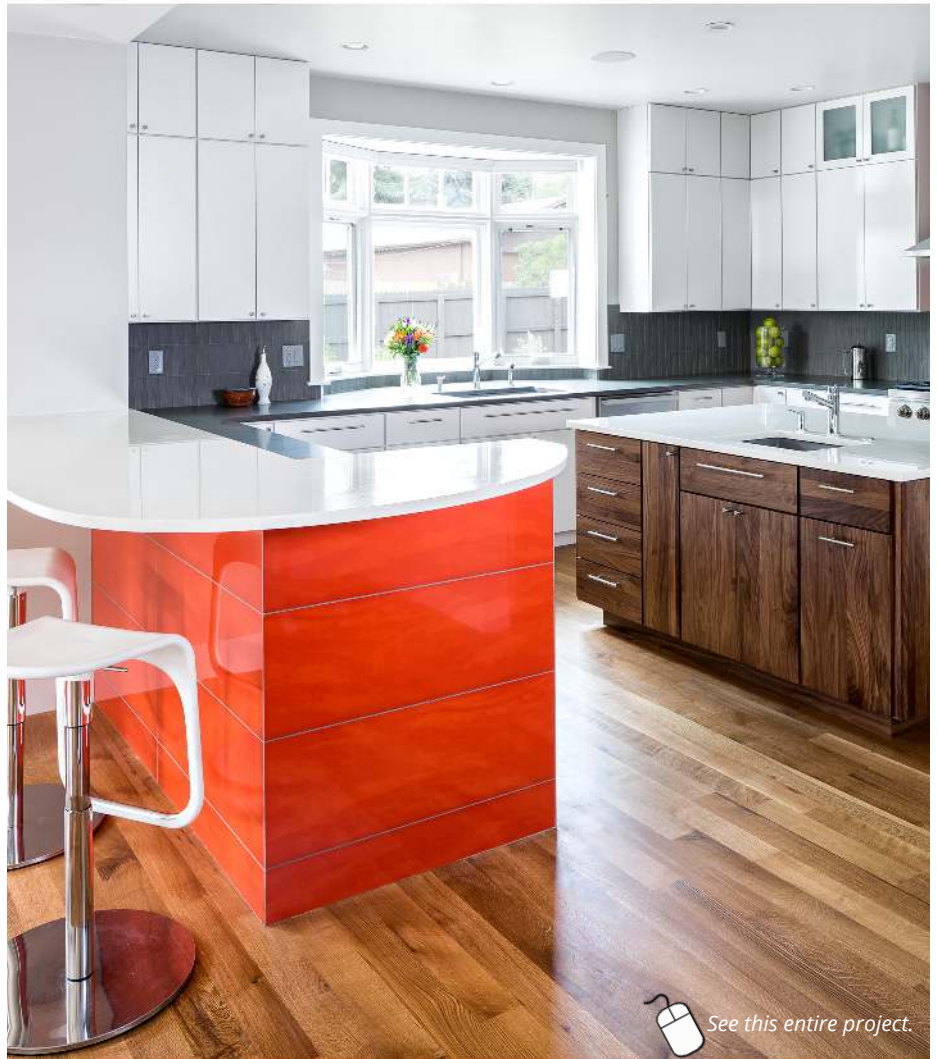


Design Ideas for Every Room

Home Office

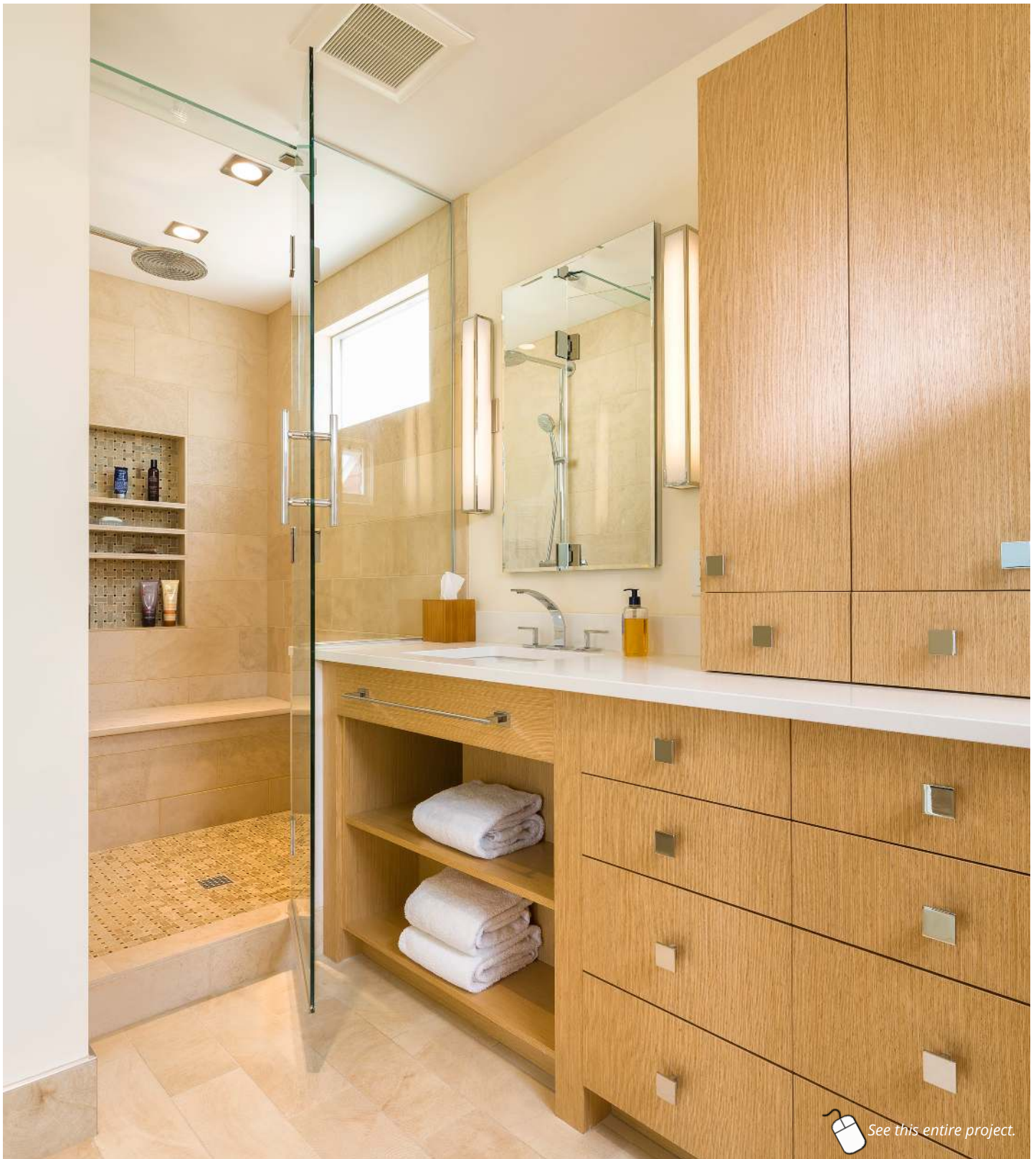
